FINDINGS

Pursuant to the provisions of the Alabama Environmental Management Act, <u>Ala. Code</u> §§ 22-22A-1 to 22-22A-17 (2015 Rplc. Vol.), the Alabama Air Pollution Control Act, <u>Ala. Code</u> §§ 22-28-1 to 22-28-23 (2015 Rplc. Vol.), the Alabama Department of Environmental Management (hereinafter, the "Department" or "ADEM") Administrative Code of Regulations (hereinafter, "ADEM Admin. Code R.") promulgated pursuant thereto, and the federal Clean Air Act, 42 U.S.C. 7401 to 7671q, as amended, the Department makes the following FINDINGS:

- 1. J & J Metal and Salvage, Inc. (hereinafter, "J & J") operates Exit 100 Metal Recycling Center located at 13051 Ridgewood Drive in McCalla, Tuscaloosa County, Alabama (hereinafter, the "Site").
- 2. The Department is a duly constituted department of the State of Alabama pursuant to Ala. Code §§ 22-22A-1 to 22-22A-17 (2015 Rplc. Vol.).
- 3. Pursuant to <u>Ala. Code</u> § 22-22A-4(n) (2015 Rplc. Vol.), the Department is the state air pollution control agency for the purposes of the federal Clean Air Act, 42 U.S.C. 7401 to 7671q, as amended. In addition, the Department is authorized to administer

and enforce the provisions of the Alabama Air Pollution Control Act, <u>Ala. Code</u> §§ 22-28-1 to 22-28-23 (2015 Rplc. Vol.).

- 4. ADEM Admin. Code r. 335-3-3-.01(2)(b)1 states that "...open burning must take place on the property on which the combustible fuel originates."
- 5. ADEM Admin. Code r. 335-3-3-.01(2)(b)4 states that "Only vegetation and untreated wood may be burned. It is unauthorized to open burn heavy oils, asphalt products, plastics, vinyl materials, insulation, paper, cardboard, natural or synthetic rubber, salvage or scrap materials, chemicals, garbage, treated or painted wood, or any trash."
- 6. On January 28, 2019, the Department received a complaint of unauthorized open burning at the Site.
- 7. On February 8, 2019, Department personnel conducted a complaint investigation of the Site and observed evidence of unauthorized open burning of copper, cardboard, and a large electric motor. While on Site, the Department Inspector made contact with Mike Weeks, President, and advised him of the Open Burning regulations and to cease all unauthorized open burning.
- 8. Pursuant to <u>Ala. Code</u> § 22-22A-5(18)c., *as amended*, in determining the amount of any penalty, the Department must give consideration to the seriousness of the violation, including any irreparable harm to the environment and any threat to the health or safety of the public; the standard of care manifested by such person; the economic benefit which delayed compliance may confer upon such person; the nature, extent and degree of success of such person's efforts to minimize or mitigate the effects of such violation upon the environment; such person's history of previous violations; and the ability of such person to pay such penalty. Any civil penalty assessed pursuant to this authority shall not exceed \$25,000.00 for each violation, provided however, that the total penalty

assessed in an order issued by the Department shall not exceed \$250,000.00. Each day such violation continues shall constitute a separate violation. In arriving at this civil penalty, the Department has considered the following:

- A. SERIOUSNESS OF THE VIOLATION: J & J conducted unauthorized open burning of refuse at the Site. The Department considers this violation to be serious.
- B. THE STANDARD OF CARE: There appeared to be no care taken by J & J to comply with the applicable requirements of the ADEM Admin. Code rs. 335-3-3-.01(2)(b)1 and 335-3-3-.01(2)(b)4.
- C. ECONOMIC BENEFIT WHICH DELAYED COMPLIANCE MAY HAVE CONFERRED: J & J likely derived economic benefit by not legally disposing of refuse.
- D. EFFORTS TO MINIMIZE OR MITIGATE THE EFFECTS OF THE VIOLATION UPON THE ENVIRONMENT: There were no efforts by J & J to mitigate possible effects of these violations upon the environment.
- E. HISTORY OF PREVIOUS VIOLATIONS: J & J has no previous history of violations with the Department for illegal open burning.
- F. THE ABILITY TO PAY: J & J has not alleged an inability to pay the civil penalty.
- G. OTHER FACTORS: The Department has carefully considered the six statutory penalty factors enumerated in <u>Ala. Code</u> § 22-22A-5(18)c., *as amended*, as well as the need for timely and effective enforcement, and has concluded that a civil penalty herein is appropriate (*See* "Attachment A", which is hereby incorporated into these Findings).

ORDER

Based upon the foregoing FINDINGS and pursuant to <u>Ala. Code</u> §§22-22A-5(10), 22-22A-5(12), 22-22-5(18), and 22-28-18 (2015 Rplc. Vol.), it is hereby ORDERED:

A. That, not later than forty-five days after the issuance of this Order, J & J shall pay to the Department a civil penalty in the amount of \$5,000.00 for the violations cited herein. Said penalty shall be made payable to the Alabama Department of Environment Management by certified or cashier's check and shall be submitted to:

- B. That, immediately upon receipt of this Order and continuing thereafter, J & J shall ensure immediate and future compliance with ADEM Admin. Code rs. 335-3-3-.01(2)(b)1 and 335-3-3-.01(2)(b)4.
- C. That, should any provision of this Order be declared by a court of competent jurisdiction or the Environmental Management Commission to be inconsistent with Federal or State law and therefore unenforceable, the remaining provisions hereof shall remain in full force and effect.
- D. Except as otherwise set forth herein, this Order is not and shall not be interpreted to be a permit or modification of an existing permit under federal, State or local law, and shall not be construed to waive or relieve J & J of its obligations to comply in the future with any permit or other written direction from the Department.
- E. That, issuance of this Administrative Order does not preclude the Department from seeking criminal fines or other appropriate sanctions or relief against J & J for the violations cited herein.

F.	That, failure to comply v	vith the provisions of	this Administrative Order
shall constitu	ate cause for commencemen	t of legal action by th	e Department against J & J
for recovery	of additional civil penalties,	, criminal fines, or oth	ner appropriate sanctions or
relief.
