Program Management and Administration

During FY2005, the Drinking Water Branch had two staff members leave the Branch. One environmental engineer transferred to another Division within the Department. That vacancy was filled with a new hire. Also, the Branch Chief retired in September 2005. The existing Groundwater Source Section Chief was promoted to the Branch Chief position. To date, the vacant Groundwater Source Section Chief position has not been filled. The Branch staff currently totals 22; including 10 engineers, 6 environmental scientists, 4 administrative assistants and 2 supervisors.

There were 659 water systems inspected during 2005, and the number of permits issued or renewed was 204. There were 65 NOV's and 5 Administrative Orders issued this fiscal year. The Department completed the process to modify Division 7 rules to provide clarification and achieve consistency with federal requirements. These rules were finalized on December 12, 2005. The Department will be modifying Division 7 rules again in 2006 in order to obtain primacy for Stage 2 or the Disinfectants/Disinfection Byproducts Rule and the Long Term 2 Enhanced Surface Water Rule.

Program Expenditures

In FY2005, the EPA Public Water Supply Supervision Grant to the ADEM Drinking Water Branch was \$908,200 based on a Congressional appropriation of \$99,745,600 for the Drinking Water Supervision Program nationally with \$14,556,000 allocated for Region 4 states. The Drinking Water Branch budget included \$125,000 from the State General Fund and \$448,182 in permit and project fees and fines to support Drinking Water Branch activities.

Table 1 shows the Drinking Water Branch expenditures of the EPA Public Water Supply Supervision Grant in FY2005 including state funds. More than 55% of the funds were spent for direct personnel costs, 17% for employee benefits and 20% for indirect costs. Approximately 92.7% of all funds were used for personnel related costs. \$37,704 was spent on travel. Total equipment and supply expenses were \$20,414.

Alabama's Drinking Water Program is also funded from sources other than the EPA Public Water Supply Supervision Grant.

The State Revolving Loan Fund Grant sets aside various amounts of funds which can be used by the Drinking Water Program. Also, certain fees are collected from SRF loan recipients that can be used by the Drinking Water Program. A further discussion of these funds and the expenditures paid by these funds are listed below:

FUND 245 Up to 4% of the SRF grant funds can be utilized to administer the Drinking Water Program. In FY2005, a total of \$406,855 was spent for personnel costs, fringe benefits, indirect costs and professional services.

FUND 246 A maximum of 2% of the SRF grant funds can be used to provide technical assistance to small water systems. The majority of these funds are contracted to the Alabama Rural Water Association for various activities. The scope of work for this contract calls for training for water board members, providing guidance and technical assistance related to operational needs and regulatory requirements and educating operators in the area of information technology. In FY2005, \$132,888 was spent for personnel costs, fringe benefits, indirect expenses and professional services.

FUND 247 This fund was established to assist State Drinking Water Management activities. In FY2005, \$18,067 was spent to cover Drinking Water staff costs in support of such activities as the optimization program. This program is used to evaluate the ability of surface source systems to meet new enhanced surface water treatment regulations.

FUND 248 A maximum of 15% of funds from the SRF Grant can be used to support such activities as Wellhead Protection and Capacity Development. In FY2005, \$102,328 was spent on personnel, fringe benefits, indirect costs and professional services.

FUND 955 The Department charges Drinking Water SRF recipients a fee of 0.75% annually, based on the outstanding principal of each loan. In FY2005, \$906,510 was collected and \$587,644 was spent on personnel, fringe benefits, indirect costs and professional services.

There is another grant fund source available to the Drinking Water Program to fund specific security functions related to the Drinking Water Program. A further discussion of this fund source and the expenditures paid by these funds are listed below:

FUND 243 Immediately following the terrorist attacks of September 11, 2001, Congress set aside monies under the Bioterrorism Act Security Grant Program to provide technical assistance and training related to a public water system's vulnerability and ability to respond to counter-terrorism activities. These funds are specifically directed at public water systems serving less than 100,000 people. Since 2002, Alabama has received \$379,500 in grant funds from this source. In FY2005, \$97,183 of these funds were spent by the Drinking Water Branch for security program related personnel costs, fringe benefits, indirect expenses and professional services.

There are two non-grant fund sources available for use by the Drinking Water Program. These funds consist of revenues collected from drinking water facilities who utilize state labs in lieu of private labs to perform certain required sample collection and analysis of their drinking water. A further discussion of these funds and the expenditures paid by these funds are listed below:

FUND 241 This fund is the bacteriological sampling fund. Fees collected from water systems that utilize the state bacteriological labs for bacteriological monitoring are placed in this fund. In FY2005, this fund received \$229,616. All monies in this fund were used to compensate the state labs for the analyses provided.

FUND 242 This fund is the chemical sampling fund. Fees collected from water systems that utilize the ADEM chemical lab for chemical monitoring are placed in this fund. In FY2005, this fund received \$143,102. All monies in this fund were used to compensate the ADEM chemical lab for the analyses provided, plus the cost of collection supplies (e.g., bottles, reagents, ice, etc.).

Permitting Activities

In order to operate, a public water system is required to have a valid permit issued by the Department. Community water system permits are valid for six years and non-community permits are valid for ten years. Before a permit can be considered for renewal, an application package (application, fee and any additional information required by the Department) must be submitted to ADEM for review and processing. The district inspector responsible for ensuring a water system complies with Department rules reviews the information on the application and in the system files before issuing the renewal permit. Special conditions are included in some permits to correct system deficiencies, to address areas of non-compliance or to place requirements on a system that are not specifically addressed in the permit general conditions. For water purchased from other public water systems, copies of the purchase contracts are required as a part of the application process to ensure that each purchase system has a legal contract for an adequate water source.

Permit renewal applications were processed and issued for one hundred and fifteen water systems. Twenty-three permit modifications were issued for changes in ownership, consolidation of water systems, facility name changes, or other changes. Table 2 contains the breakdown of Operating Permit activity.

A branch staff member has the responsibility of implementing the segmental water system program. Segmental water systems are not defined as Public Water Systems and are usually apartment complexes which obtain their water supply from a Public Water System. In turn, the apartment complex (or other segmental system) may or may not install individual water meters or utilize ratio billing to obtain the average cost to supply water to each unit on a monthly basis. For these systems, a segmental water system certificate is required, at a cost of \$100. Nineteen apartment complexes became new Segmental Water Systems in FY2005. Table 3 contains a list of segmental water systems.

Public water systems must obtain a permit prior to the start of construction on any major addition (e.g. storage tanks, booster pump stations, new sources, and significant water main additions). A satisfactory application package (permit application, fee, and plans/specifications stamped by a professional engineer) must be received before the Department will issue a construction permit. Upon issuance of the permit, the project information is logged into a database and its progress tracked through monthly reports submitted by the consulting engineer for the project. Staff engineers reviewed and issued 69 construction permits in FY2005.

Approval to place the permitted project into service is given after submittal of the required information. This information includes a project completion form with material quantities and final costs, satisfactory bacteriological results and pressure test results. An on-site final inspection of the new facilities is generally required. Record drawings must be provided to ADEM within 30 days of the final inspection on the project. A new water system becomes a regulated public water system when a compliance activation date is set and monitoring requirements are established. Table 4 lists public water system construction permit activity.

Water System Inspection Activities

The branch staff inspects all community and non-community systems on an annual basis. Every third year, a sanitary survey is conducted on each water system, in lieu of an annual inspection. The goal of these visits is to review the required documentation maintained at the Department and water system office, discuss system operation and maintenance policies, check chlorine residuals, pH, and iron content, and visually inspect the system facilities to confirm proper operation and maintenance. During these inspections, branch staff offers technical assistance to water system personnel to improve system operation. Issues such as deteriorating equipment, inadequate water storage tank maintenance, proposed or new regulations, public relations, operator certification, water conservation plans, bacteriological/chemical monitoring plans, monitoring/reporting violations, and proposed or ongoing construction projects are frequently discussed. Additional visits to water systems are performed to finalize construction projects, address customer complaints and monitoring violations, to conduct susceptibility analysis of sources and to attend board/council meetings. The USEPA Sanitary Survey form is used during annual inspections and sanitary surveys and the EPA Sanitary Survey guidance document is used when conducting a sanitary survey in FY2005.

Six hundred sixty-six annual inspections, including 334 sanitary surveys, and 110 other visits were conducted in FY2005. Appendix A lists water system visit activity.

SDWIS/State Activities

In early FY2005, the Drinking Water Branch implemented the CDS portion of SDWIS/STATE. CDS allows for automated compliance determination and sample tracking. A branch representative attended the 2005 ASDWA/EPA Data Management Users Conference in New Orleans, Louisiana during April, 2005. The Beta (Evaluation) version of the web-based SDWIS/STATE (SSWr1) was evaluated by branch staff. The branch started reporting Drinking Water Branch Data to EPA using FedRep, which is part of the Modernized Data Flow System

implemented by EPA. Data was reported via the traditional DTF format as well as the new XML format using FedRep. Starting in FY2006, EPA will accept data in the new XML format only.

Water System Security Program

As a result of the Public Health Security and Bioterrorism Preparedness and Response Act of 2002 (Bioterrorism Act), the branch has successfully assisted small-to-medium community water systems (CWS) to develop vulnerability assessments (VA) and emergency response plans (ERP) to address bioterrorism and other intentional acts that could disrupt or compromise the safety and reliability of drinking water supplies. In efforts to ensure the safety of Alabama's drinking water supply, branch staff are currently working with CWS's serving a population less than 3,300, that did not fall under the Bioterrorism Act, to conduct VA's and ERP's.

The Branch is continuing to update and maintain its e-mail distribution list to quickly communicate security updates to drinking water utilities. Additionally, branch staff performs periodic reviews of The Water ISAC (Information Sharing & Analysis Center), to gather security information that can be passed along to the utilities by e-mail.

During hurricanes Dennis and Katrina, the Drinking Water Branch activated and utilized the Standard Operating Procedures (SOP) which were designed to ensure prompt and efficient responses between the utility, public health personnel, law enforcement, medical and other emergency responders in the event of an intentional, natural, or terrorist act involving public water systems.

Branch staff members continue to conduct workshops, security inspections, and to assist drinking water utilities with emergency response, as well as provide technical assistance and information to utilities, consultants, other Department staff, and the general public.

Capacity Development Program

The Safe Drinking Water Act requires states to develop a Water System Capacity Development Strategy and Implementation Plan. The basis of Alabama's plan is to limit the development of non-viable systems. Procedures established by this plan were incorporated into a Capacity Development Strategy which has been utilized to reduce the number of systems that do not have the technical, financial or managerial ability to operate in accordance with state and federal requirements. An aspect of this plan involves partnering with the Alabama Rural Water Association (ARWA). In FY2005, the Department contracted with the ARWA for the ARWA to provide a capacity development report for six water systems which were having difficulty complying with regulations. Those water systems are: the Ridgeville Water System, the Big Wills Water System, the Repton Water System, the Wilton Water System, the Snowdown Water System, and the Pinckard Water System. Final evaluation reports were submitted by the ARWA for each water system in October 2005. The Drinking Water Branch is working with these systems to correct the deficiencies noted during the Capacity Development Studies. Also in FY2005, the Department prepared and submitted to the Governor's office the Triennial Capacity

Development Report. This report profiles ADEM's long history of working with public drinking water systems to improve their technical, financial, and managerial abilities.

Consumer Confidence Report Program

The 1996 amendments to the Safe Drinking Water Act (SDWA) require community water systems to provide an annual Consumer Confidence Report (CCR) to their customers. The content of the CCR and delivery method are dictated by Drinking Water Branch regulations. The CCR is to include information for each calendar year and is to be delivered to customers and the Drinking Water branch no later than July 1 of the following year. In addition to the copy of the CCR supplied to the Branch, a water system must also submit a Certification Form stating the CCR delivery method met Division 7 regulations. The Certification Form is due by July 31 of each year.

This Annual Report covers the CCRs for calendar year 2004, which were to be delivered by July 1, 2005. **Of the 500 water systems required to complete a CCR, 320 met the July 1 deadline. Most of the late CCRs were received after the issuance of a Warning Letter to the system; however, thirty-nine Notices of Violation were issued for late CCRs.**

The CCR regulations were modified in FY2005 so that the copy of the CCR and the Certification Form are both due in the Drinking Water Branch on July 1. The modification was made so that there was only one deadline for the submittal of the CCR and Certification Form. Based on previous years' data, this modification will make it easier on the Branch and water system personnel and should increase water system compliance levels. The modifications to regulations were to be effective in the first quarter of FY2006.

Bottled Water Program

The Drinking Water Branch is responsible for approving bottled water sources and keeps a database of approved sources in the state. An informational package is mailed to persons interested in the development of a bottled water source. This package lists the steps needed for approval of a bottled water source. Treatment of the source is based on its raw water quality. A Branch representative conducts an on-site inspection of the source and its treatment facility and issues an initial approval or non-approval of the bottled water source. After approval of a source, the Food and Drug Administration through an agreement with the Alabama Department of Public Health (ADPH) is responsible for the bottled water facility.

Nine inquiries were received from individuals planning to develop a bottled water source in FY2005. There are fifteen approved sources of bottled water in Alabama. The fifteen sources include the use of raw water from an approved public water supply source, and several private well and spring sources.

Potability Certificate Program

There is an agreement with the US Department of Agriculture (USDA) and the ADPH for ADEM to issue water potability certificates to meat processing facilities, ice producing facilities and dairies. These facilities are required to submit monthly satisfactory bacteriological results and maintain a chlorine residual of one part per million (ppm). Based on the review of twelve monthly bacteriological results, renewal of the certificate is granted or denied. Ten potability certificate renewals were issued and no new facilities were approved for usage in FY2005.

Water Well Licensing Program

One hundred forty-one well driller licenses were issued in FY2005. Of the total number of licenses issued, 7 were new licensees. The Department received \$28,200 for license fees, and received documentation on 1,130 wells drilled. Of the 141 licensed well drillers, 9 licensed well drillers who reside in Alabama were visited with attempts to visit 2 others. These visits included responding to three well complaints.

For those who are interested in qualifying for an Alabama Water Well Driller's License or to continue certification with the National Ground Water Association (NGWA), the Department offers the opportunity for well drillers to take the NGWA exams throughout the year. A total of 21 exams were administered at the regularly scheduled Alabama Ground Water Association meetings, at ADEM headquarters, and at other locations during the past year. A listing of all licensed well drillers in Alabama can be obtained from the Department.

Source Water Assessment – Surface Water Sources

Alabama has completed the process of assessing the source waters for each of its surface water treatment plants, as required by amendments to the Safe Drinking Act of 1996. The 73 water systems include 86 active water treatment plants. An assessment must be completed on a proposed new surface water source, prior to issuing a permit to construct the intake from that source. The assessments are to be reviewed, and updated if necessary, when the system applies to renew its operating permit (every 6 years). A completed SWAP for a surface water source must include the following:

- Delineation of the watershed,
- Contaminant source inventory,
- Susceptibility analysis of each possible contaminant source in the inventory,
- Contingency plan, and

- A public awareness requirement

The majority of potential contaminant sites within the source water assessment areas have been given a “low susceptibility” ranking. The main reason for this is that many of the reservoirs were originally constructed as drinking water sources, and therefore, use by the public is strictly controlled. The majority of potential contaminants stem from highway bridge crossings where vehicular traffic is high but the potential for a “contamination event” is low.

Source Water Assessment – Groundwater Sources

All public water supply systems have completed a Source Water Assessment Program (SWAP) for each of their existing groundwater sources. All water systems are required to update their SWAP’s when applying for reissuance of their permits-to-furnish water. All new groundwater sources must have a completed SWAP, prior to using the source for potable water. A completed SWAP for a groundwater source must include the following:

- Delineation of the source water assessment area (SWAA),
- An inventory of the possible contaminant sources within the SWAA,
- A susceptibility analysis of each possible contaminant source in the inventory, and
- A public awareness requirement

When the Source Water Assessment Program requirements were initially promulgated, Alabama had a total of 414 public water supply systems that utilized one or more groundwater sources. Each of these systems was required to complete a SWAP for their groundwater sources. These public water supply systems were categorized as follows:

- 310 Community Groundwater Systems
- 75 Non-Community Transient Groundwater Systems, and
- 29 Non-Community Non-Transient Groundwater Systems

Over the past year Alabama has received Source Water Assessment Reports for eight new or expanded groundwater sources. All of these new Source Water Assessment Reports were from existing public water systems. Of these eight reports, all were for new well sources. The Source Water Assessment Program has been finalized for five of the new well sources. The SWAP’s for the other three groundwater sources are currently in the process of being reviewed and finalized.

Wellhead Protection Program

The wellhead protection program is regulated through the Drinking Water regulations, but is administered by a staff member in ADEM’s Groundwater Branch.

Underground storage tanks are the greatest source of chemical contaminants in ground water in Alabama. As of the end of March 2004, 628 UST compliance inspections were completed within wellhead protection areas and over 300 corrective action sites are located within a WHPP or within 1 mile of a public well. Ten UIC permits were issued within a wellhead area.

The ADEM and the ARWA continue to work closely together to implement the Wellhead Protection Program. The ADEM also participated in the Annual ARWA Groundwater Forum. The forum provides an opportunity to review the ARWA Groundwater Technician activities for the past year and to discuss and propose activities and goals for 2005.

Three Wellhead Protection Management Plans were reviewed during FY2005. WHPP signs were awarded to the systems and promotional events scheduled to recognize the systems. WHPP certificates of completion were awarded to the three communities at the Annual Alabama Rural Water Association Conference and Awards Banquet in March 2005. These communities include the City of Geneva, the City of Alabaster and the Town of Mosses. The WHP Plans for the Town of Gordon, the Town of Bakerhill and the City of Leeds are in process and will be finalized and approved in FY 2006. The Annual Alabama Groundwater Conference was held in June at the Gordon Persons Building in Montgomery. One hundred and fifty people were registered for the conference. The conference included technical sessions and a breakout session for Wellhead Protection.

The Groundwater Guardian program continues to be a focus for the Department's Wellhead Protection Program. The ADEM Groundwater Guardian Affiliate team, comprised of a representative from ARWA, a public utility and two ADEM employees, meets quarterly to develop promotional activities for the program. During this reporting period, the committee submitted the necessary reports for designation as a Groundwater Guardian Affiliate. In addition, 10 communities in Alabama were designated by the National Groundwater Foundation as Groundwater Guardians in 2005. The communities are the City of Tuscumbia, the City of Eufaula, Madison County, the City of Madison, Crenshaw County, Dale County, Sumter/Marengo Counties, Talladega County, the St Clair County Groundwater Festival Committee and the Etowah County Groundwater Festival Committee. Communities that were recognized at the Alabama Groundwater Conference Awards ceremony were the City of Tuscumbia, the City of Eufaula, Madison County, the City of Madison, Limestone County and the St Clair County Groundwater Festival Committee and the Etowah County Groundwater Festival Committee.

The Groundwater Festival Program continues to be a part of the Wellhead Protection Program by providing a structured outreach and education event. It provides an avenue for utilities to become involved in and initiate drinking water education programs in their service area. A Groundwater Water Festival is now held in 25 counties in the State. New festivals were held in Crenshaw and Dale counties and three new festival committees were formed during FY2005. The Department has served as the facilitator and will coordinate the Covington, Talladega and Washington County Festivals.

Area Wide Optimization Program (AWOP) Participation

ADEM continued to be an active participant in the EPA Region 4 Area Wide Optimization Multi-State Pilot Program. The AWOP-MSPP is a cooperative effort to optimize performance of existing surface water treatment plants. The main goal of the program is to maximize public health protection from microbial contaminants by coordinating existing system resources with proven performance improvement tools. Other States participating in the program include Georgia, Kentucky, South Carolina, North Carolina and Florida. Several members of the Drinking Water Branch's Surface Water Section participated in and conducted activities associated with AWOP-MSPP. These activities included the following:

- ADEM staff attended the three AWOP quarterly meetings and workshops during FY2005. These meetings were held in November 2004 in Frankfort, Kentucky, April 2005 in Atlanta, Georgia and July 2005 in Asheville, North Carolina.
- ADEM participated in developmental activities for the Distribution System Comprehensive Performance Evaluation with the EPA Technical Support Center during FY2005. The two developmental CPEs were conducted in Alabama at the Montgomery Water Works and Sewer Board in July 2005 and the Northport Water Works in September 2005.
- ADEM conducted a seventh training session for surface water treatment plant personnel in October 2004 at Auburn University Montgomery.
- ADEM completed the fourth round of Performance Based Training (PBT) with six water systems during the year. In December 2005, ADEM will begin a fifth round of Performance Based Training with six water systems. PBT is the follow-up component being developed by the Region 4 AWOP-MSPP. It is designed to utilize centralized training events for multiple utilities to achieve documented and measurable results toward optimization. The surface water systems participating in the fourth round of PBT Sessions were The Montgomery Water Works C.T. Perry WTP, Mobile Area Water and Sewer Service H.E. Meyers and E.M. Stickney treatment plants, Auburn Water Works Board, Birmingham Water Works Western WTP and G.U.S.C. Bessemer WTP. The fifth round participants are Talladega Water Works, Sylacauga Utilities Board, Scottsboro Water, Sewer and Gas Board, Cullman Utilities Board, Gadsden Water Works, and Birmingham Water Works – Shades Mtn. WTP.
- Each Surface Water Engineer has made AWOP a priority for the systems in their district and incorporates AWOP into their daily activities.

Enforcement Activities

The enforcement activities are shown in Table 5.

Follow-up inspections were held with ten community water systems that incurred MCL violations. These follow-up inspections were conducted as either separate inspections or in conjunction with the annual sanitary survey inspection, if an annual survey had not been conducted during that fiscal year. Circumstances surrounding the violation were discussed, and if necessary, procedural changes were implemented by the system to prevent recurrence of the violation.

Bacteriological Monitoring and Compliance

A total of 555 community water systems were required to monitor for bacteriological contaminants. Forty-one systems incurred monitoring violations, and eight systems incurred nine MCL violations. Greenpark South Mobile Home Park incurred four monitoring violations for failing to properly monitor the first four months of the fiscal year and Fort Rucker incurred four monitoring violations for collecting nine samples in the month instead of their required number of ten samples. Beatrice, Eufaula Youth Center, Franklin, Gurley, Washington County and Woodland water systems also incurred more than one monitoring violation and the Mount Andrew water system incurred more than one MCL violation. Two systems incurred six reporting violations

for failing to report sample results in a satisfactory time frame. A complete list of all water systems with bacteriological violations can be found in Appendices B and C.

Ninety-three percent of the community water systems (see Charts 1, 2, and 3) were in compliance with monitoring and reporting requirements for the coliform standard and 99% were in compliance with MCL standards. Bacteriological compliance rates were slightly lower for monitoring and reporting requirements and were higher for maximum contaminant levels as the previous fiscal year. The major cause for the lower monitoring compliance rate was the failure of small water systems to collect five samples in the month following a month in which they collected a positive sample.

Thirty NTNC Water Systems were required to monitor for bacteriological contaminants. Four systems incurred five monitoring violations and three systems incurred three MCL violations. Only the Golden Rod Broilers water system incurred more than one monitoring violation.

Sixty-six Transient Non-Community Water Systems were required to monitor for bacteriological contaminants. Eighteen systems incurred 26 monitoring violations, and nine systems incurred ten MCL violations. Camp Alamisco incurred two bacteriological MCL violations during the fiscal year. Rock-N-Chair Truck Stop incurred four monitoring violations, Oasis Travel Center incurred three monitoring violations and Camp Alamisco, Camp Lee and Payne Lake USFS incurred two monitoring violations. Seventy-two percent of the transient non-community water systems were in compliance with monitoring and reporting requirements for the coliform standard. Eighty-six percent of the systems were in compliance with MCL standards.

Chemical Monitoring and Compliance

Chemical monitoring is scheduled based on the calendar year; therefore, only a summary of the results for the present fiscal year will be included in this annual report. A complete report of chemical compliance data for calendar year 2005

will be included in the 2005 annual violations report which will be produced in May or June 2006.

Ninety-nine water systems monitored for inorganic contaminants. All water systems with sources were required to monitor for nitrates, with no system incurring an MCL violation.

Two hundred and fifty-nine water systems monitored for volatile organic chemicals (VOCs). Oneonta exceeded the MCL for Tetrachloroethylene. Of the 505 ground and surface sources analyzed during the fiscal year, 119 sources contained thirteen different regulated VOCs. Appendix D lists the organic chemical contaminant detections by water source.

Two hundred and twenty-three water systems monitored for synthetic organic chemicals (SOCs). Hawk Pride incurred an MCL violation for Di(2-ethylhexyl)phthalate and St. Elmo-Irvington incurred an MCL violation for Ethylene Dibromide. Of the 423 ground and surface sources analyzed for SOCs, 26 sources contained seven different regulated SOCs.

Seventy-three surface and 53 ground water systems were required to monitor for turbidity. Although several systems were late in reporting turbidity data during the year, no systems incurred treatment technique violations or monitoring violations.

Lead and Copper Monitoring Program

Two hundred and seventy-five systems monitored for Lead and Copper in FY2005. Triana and Marion County exceeded the lead action level in FY2005. Red Bay exceeded the lead action level and was allowed to make minor corrections to its corrosion control and resample. Red Bay met the action levels based on their resampling. Seven water systems incurred monitoring violations for failing to collect their lead and copper samples between June and September.

Disinfection Byproduct Monitoring and Compliance

One hundred and sixty-seven community and NTNC water systems with a ground or surface water source were required to monitor for disinfection byproducts (DBP). DBPs include total trihalomethanes (TTHM) and haloacetic acids (HAA5). Listed below are the systems that incurred MCL violations.

While the majority of groundwater systems have low levels of TTHM and HAA5, two groundwater systems exceeded TTHM MCL. The majority of the TTHM found in these systems come from the brominated TTHM. All of these groundwater systems are located in southwest Alabama and have sources that are high in dissolved solids containing bromides and chlorides. Meetings have been held with these systems to determine the appropriate enforcement action and assistance needed to return them to compliance.

All systems with a surface source or a source that is classified as groundwater under the influence of surface water (GWUDI) are required to monitor for total organic carbon (TOC). These systems were required to collect a raw water and a combined filtered water sample each month. TOC results from each plant are evaluated to determine if the plant is meeting TOC removal requirements or to determine if monitoring could be reduced to quarterly for TOCs. The York Water System incurred a treatment technique violation for failure to meet TOC removal requirements.

Laboratory Certification Program

Department regulations require an annual fee for recertification of Drinking Water Laboratories. The fee for certification varied from \$125.00 for bacteriological certification to a maximum of \$500.00 for chemical laboratory certification. Twenty-four thousand six hundred and twenty-five dollars (\$24,625) were collected in laboratory certification fees. All chemical and bacteriological analyses of water samples required by the State must be analyzed at a laboratory certified by ADEM.

Forty-three bacteriological laboratories were certified or recertified during the fiscal year. There were two new certified bacteriological laboratories. Columbus Water Quality Laboratory, one of the new certified laboratories, became the first out-of-state certified bacteriological laboratory. The certified bacteriological laboratories consisted of three State Health Department laboratories, 25 water system laboratories, two military laboratories, eleven commercial laboratories, one county laboratory and one state college laboratory. One certified bacteriological laboratory failed to renew their certification.

Fifty-three (18 instate and 35 out-of-state) chemical laboratories were either certified or recertified. Three out-of-state laboratories were certified for the first time to perform chemical analyses of water samples. Appendices E and F contain a list of certified chemical and bacteriological laboratories.

The Department allowed certified chemical laboratories to choose their own supplier of performance evaluation (PE) samples. Laboratories are allowed one retest for any contaminant they failed during the first PE study.

Drinking Water State Revolving Fund Activities

The Drinking Water State Revolving Fund Annual Report is incorporated by reference and has been submitted to the SRF & Surface Water Grants Section of EPA Region IV under separate cover.

Operator Certification Program

The FY2005 Alabama Operator Certification Annual Report is incorporated by reference and has been submitted to the EPA Region IV Operator Certification Coordinator under separate cover.

Response to Natural Disasters

The 2005 Atlantic hurricane season resulted in two major hurricanes that directly impacted public water systems in the state of Alabama.

Hurricane Dennis was the first major hurricane of the 2005 hurricane season. Historically, it was the strongest hurricane ever to form before the month of August. Dennis made landfall on the morning of July 10 in the same area that Hurricane Ivan made landfall less than one year earlier. Much like Hurricane Ivan, Dennis weakened just before landfall and its maximum sustained winds dropped from 145 mph (Category 4 strength) to 120 mph (Category 3 strength). Once on land, Hurricane Dennis tracked to the north through the western side of the state losing strength and becoming a tropical depression by early July 11.

Hurricane Katrina was the third major hurricane and first Category 5 hurricane of the 2005 hurricane season. Katrina made landfall on the morning of August 29 along the Central Gulf Coast near Buras-Triumph, Louisiana. Like Hurricane Dennis, Katrina weakened just before landfall and its maximum sustained winds dropped from 175 mph (Category 5 strength) to 125 mph (Category 3 strength). Heavy damage was inflicted on the coasts of Louisiana, Mississippi, and Alabama making Katrina the most destructive and costliest natural disaster in the history of the United States. Once on land, Hurricane Katrina tracked to the north with its eastern edge passing over the western side of the state of Alabama. Due to the physical size of Hurricane Katrina, there was devastation far from the eye of the hurricane. According to the National Hurricane Center, Katrina was possibly the largest hurricane of its strength ever recorded.

Due to high winds and heavy rainfall associated with both these storms, many public water systems in Alabama were adversely affected. From the onset of each storm, Drinking Water Branch staff monitored the storm's effect on the state's public water systems. Overall, approximately 100 of the state's public water systems experienced significant operational problems due to Hurricane Dennis and approximately 75 experienced significant operational problems due to Hurricane Katrina. These problems ranged from extended power outages to complete water system failure. While most of Alabama's public water systems were able to weather the storms with little or no interruptions to service, many systems were without pressure and power for several days requiring the issuance of boil water notices.

Tracking the status of the affected water systems presented many challenges, due to the communication difficulties, conflicting information, and ever changing operational status. Branch personnel spent many hours on the phone contacting affected systems and assisting them when possible. To keep up with the status of these water systems an Excel® spreadsheet was developed. This spreadsheet was updated continuously as reports from affected water systems were received. The updated spreadsheet was disseminated daily to other key relief agencies, such as the ADPH and FEMA.

Nearly 100% of Alabama's public water systems affected by Hurricane Dennis returned to normal operation by July 15, 2005 (i.e., five days after the hurricane made landfall). Even though both hurricanes struck land with basically the same wind strength, Hurricane Katrina was physically much larger than Hurricane Dennis. It wasn't until September 9, 2005 (i.e., twelve days after the hurricane made landfall), before nearly 100% of Alabama's public water systems affected by Hurricane Katrina returned to normal operation.
