Program Management and Administration

During FY2008 the Drinking Water Branch added one administrative assistant to its staff. Currently, the Branch has 23 employees; including 9 environmental engineers, 6 environmental scientists, 5 administrative assistants and 3 supervisors. The Branch has one vacant environmental engineer position. That position has been vacant for two years.

ADEM's Drinking Water Branch regulates "public water systems." There are two categories of public water systems regulated by the Drinking Water Branch. The first category is community water systems, and the second category is non-community water systems.

Community water systems are water systems that serve the same people year-round. Examples of community water systems include water systems owned and operated by cities, towns, counties, and mobile home parks. At the end of FY2008, there were 535 community water systems in Alabama.

Non-community water systems are water systems that serve the public but do not serve the same people year-round. There are two types of non-community water systems: A non-transient non-community water system serves the same people more than six months per year, but not year round. Examples of non-transient non-community water systems include schools and industries that have their own water supply system. At the end of FY2008 there were 26 non-transient non-community water systems in Alabama. A transient non-community water system serves the public, but not the same individuals, at least sixty days per year. Examples of transient non-community water systems include rest areas and campgrounds that have their own water supply system. At the end of FY2008 there were 63 transient non-community water systems in Alabama.

The Drinking Water Branch conducted 755 site visits (i.e., water system inspections) during FY2008, and the number of permits issued or renewed was 136. There were 4 Notices of Violation (NOV) and 30 Administrative Orders (AO) issued in FY2008. The Department is currently modifying Division 7 rules to obtain primacy for the federal Ground Water Rule and to incorporate changes made by the USEPA to the Lead and Copper Rule. The proposed rule changes should be finalized in early 2009.

Program Expenditures

In FY2008 the Congressional appropriation for the Public Water Supply Supervision Grant Program was \$97,554,000. Of this amount, \$14,046,000 was allocated for the Region 4 states. In FY2008, Alabama's Public Water Supply Supervision Grant from EPA was \$861,200. ADEM's Drinking Water Branch did not receive or use any money from the State General Fund in FY2008. Permit fees, project fees, and fines totaling \$127,625 along with \$302,175 of departmental funds were used as state matching funds to support Drinking Water Branch activities.

Table 1 shows the Drinking Water Branch expenditures of the EPA Public Water Supply Supervision Grant in FY2008 including state matching funds. Approximately 52.1% of the funds were spent for direct personnel costs, 17.8% for employee benefits and 25.6% for indirect costs. \$32,227 was spent on travel. Total equipment and supply expenses were \$17,010.

Alabama’s Drinking Water Program is also funded from sources other than the EPA Public Water Supply Supervision Grant.

The State Revolving Loan Fund Grant sets aside various amounts of funds which can be used by the Drinking Water Program. Also, certain fees are collected from SRF loan recipients that can be used by the Drinking Water Program. A further discussion of these funds and the expenditures paid by these funds are listed below:

FUND 245 Up to 4% of the SRF grant funds can be utilized to administer the Drinking Water Program. In FY2008, only a small portion of these funds was directly utilized by the Drinking Water Branch.

FUND 246 A maximum of 2% of the SRF grant funds can be used to provide technical assistance to small water systems. In previous years, the majority of these funds were contracted to the Alabama Rural Water Association for various activities (e.g., training water board members, providing guidance and technical assistance related to operational needs and regulatory requirements, and educating operators in the area of information technology). In FY2008, no funds were reserved from the SRF grant for this purpose.

FUND 247 A maximum of 10% of the SRF grant funds can be used to assist State Drinking Water Management activities. In previous years, the majority of these funds were spent to cover Drinking Water staff costs in support of such activities as the optimization program. In FY2008, no funds were reserved from the SRF grant for this purpose.

FUND 248 A maximum of 15% of funds from the SRF Grant can be used to support such activities as Wellhead Protection and Capacity Development. In FY2008, no funds were reserved from the SRF grant for this purpose.

FUND 955 The Department charges Drinking Water SRF recipients a fee of 0.75% annually, based on the outstanding principal of each loan. In FY2008, the amount of money collected by the Department for this fund was \$1,361,180. In total, the Department spent \$1,303,546 from this fund in FY2008. The Drinking Water Branch used approximately \$1,072,115 from this fund for personnel costs, fringe benefits, and indirect expenses in FY2008.

There is another grant fund source available to the Drinking Water Program to fund specific security functions related to the Drinking Water Program. A further discussion of this fund source and the expenditures paid by these funds are listed below:

FUND 243 Immediately following the terrorist attacks of September 11, 2001, Congress set aside monies under the Bioterrorism Act Security Grant Program to provide technical assistance and training related to a public water system's vulnerability and ability to respond to counter-terrorism activities. These funds are specifically directed at public water systems serving less than 100,000 people. Since 2002, Alabama has received \$529,500 in grant funds from this source. In FY2008, \$83,661 of these funds was spent by the Drinking Water Branch for security program related personnel costs, fringe benefits, indirect expenses and professional services.

There are two non-grant fund sources available for use by the Drinking Water Program. These funds consist of revenues collected from drinking water facilities who utilize state labs in lieu of private labs to perform certain required sample collection and analysis of their drinking water. A further discussion of these funds and the expenditures paid by these funds are listed below:

FUND 241 This fund is the bacteriological sampling fund. Fees collected from water systems that utilize the state bacteriological labs for bacteriological monitoring are placed in this fund. In FY2008, this fund received \$106,477. Nearly all monies in this fund were used to compensate the state labs for the analyses provided.

FUND 242 This fund is the chemical sampling fund. Fees collected from water systems that utilize the ADEM chemical lab for chemical monitoring are placed in this fund. In FY2008, this fund received \$155,787. All monies in this fund were used to compensate the ADEM chemical lab for the analyses provided, plus the cost of collection supplies (e.g., bottles, reagents, ice, etc.).

Permitting Activities

In order to operate, a public water system is required to have a valid permit issued by the Department. Community water system permits are valid for six years and non-community permits are valid for ten years. Before a permit can be considered for renewal, an application package (application, fee and any additional information required by the Department) must be submitted to ADEM for review and processing. The district inspector responsible for ensuring a water system complies with Department rules reviews the information on the application and in the system files before issuing the renewal permit. Special conditions are included in some permits to correct system deficiencies, to address areas of non-compliance or to place requirements on a system that are not specifically addressed in the permit general conditions. For water purchased from other public water systems, copies of the purchase contracts are required as a part of the application process to ensure that each purchase system has a legal contract for an adequate water source.

Permit renewal applications were processed and issued for 9 water systems. Eleven permit modifications were issued for changes in ownership, consolidation of water systems, facility name changes, or other changes. Table 2 contains the breakdown of Operating Permit activity.

Segmental systems are no longer required to have a certificate from the Department.

Public water systems must obtain a permit prior to the start of construction on any major addition (e.g. storage tanks, booster pump stations, new sources, and significant water main additions). A satisfactory application package (permit application, fee, and plans/specifications stamped by a professional engineer) must be received before the Department will issue a construction permit. Upon issuance of the permit, the project information is logged into a database and its progress tracked through monthly reports submitted by the consulting engineer for the project. Staff engineers reviewed and issued 95 construction permits in FY2008.

Approval to place the permitted project into service is given after submittal of the required information. This information includes a project completion form with material quantities and final costs, satisfactory bacteriological results and pressure test results. An on-site final inspection of the new facilities is generally required. Record drawings must be provided to ADEM within 30 days of the final inspection on the project. A new water system becomes a regulated public water system when a compliance activation date is set and monitoring requirements are established. Below, Table 3 lists public water system construction permit activity.

Water System Inspection Activities

The branch staff inspects all community and non-community systems on an annual basis. Every third year, a sanitary survey is conducted on each water system, in lieu of an annual inspection. The goal of these visits is to review the required documentation maintained at the Department and water system office, discuss system operation and maintenance policies, check chlorine residuals, pH, and iron content, and visually inspect the system facilities to confirm proper operation and maintenance. During these inspections, the branch staff offers technical assistance to water system personnel to improve system operation. Issues such as deteriorating equipment, inadequate water storage tank maintenance, proposed or new regulations, public relations, operator certification, water conservation plans, bacteriological/chemical monitoring plans, monitoring/reporting violations, and proposed or ongoing construction projects are frequently discussed. Additional visits to water systems are performed to finalize construction projects, address customer complaints and monitoring violations, conduct susceptibility analysis of sources and attend board/council meetings. When conducting annual inspections and sanitary surveys in FY2008, the USEPA Sanitary Survey form and guidance documents were used.

755 inspections, including 297 sanitary surveys, and 458 other visits were conducted in FY2008. Appendix A lists water system visit activity.

SDWIS/State Activities

In FY2008, the Drinking Water Branch upgraded its database of record, SDWIS/STATE Web Release 1.0 (SSWr1), to Web Release 2.1 (SSWr2). CDS continued to be utilized for automated compliance determination and sample tracking. A Drinking Water Branch representative attended the 2008 ASDWA/EPA Data Management Users Conference in Nashville, Tennessee during May, 2008 to receive continuing education regarding the SDWIS/STATE program. The Branch continued to report Drinking Water Branch Data to EPA using FedRep, which is part of the Modernized Data Flow System implemented by EPA. Data was reported via XML format using FedRep. At this time, the Branch is continuing to study the possibility of using other SDWIS/STATE software to allow electronic reporting of monitoring results from the laboratories to the Department. Any electronic result submissions would have to comply with the new Cross-Media Electronic Reporting Rule (CROMERR) promulgated by EPA during FY2006. The SDWIS Lab-to-State software allows labs to submit XML files of chemical and bacteriological results using the eDWR schema to the Department. The XML files can then be directly uploaded into SSWr1. SDWIS Lab-to-State has been approved as CROMERR compliant and may be used.

Water Security Program

A cornerstone of Alabama's Homeland Security program is the protection of public infrastructure, especially public drinking water supplies; therefore the Drinking Water Branch has ongoing efforts to insure the safety of Alabama's drinking water supply. The Branch has successfully addressed and will continue to address bioterrorism, natural disasters, and other intentional acts that could disrupt or compromise the safety and reliability of drinking water supplies.

In efforts to insure the safety of Alabama's drinking water supply, the Drinking Water Branch is continuing to conduct security workshops, security inspections, and to assist drinking water utilities with emergency response, as well as provide technical assistance and information to utilities, consultants, ADEM staff, and the general public.

The Drinking Water Branch maintains a Standard Operating Procedures (SOP) which is designed to ensure prompt and efficient responses between the utility, public health personnel, law enforcement, medical and other emergency responders in the event of an intentional, natural, or terrorist act involving public water systems.

To more efficiently communicate security updates to the drinking water utilities in the State, the Drinking Water Branch is constantly updating and maintaining the Drinking Water Utility e-mail distribution list. In addition, periodic reviews of The Water ISAC (Information Sharing & Analysis Center) are performed to glean security information that can be passed along to the utilities by e-mail.

Capacity Development Program

The Safe Drinking Water Act requires states to develop a Water System Capacity Development Strategy and Implementation Plan. The basis of Alabama's plan is to limit the development of non-viable systems. Procedures established by this plan were incorporated into a Capacity Development Strategy which has been utilized to reduce the number of systems that do not have the technical, financial or managerial ability to operate in accordance with state and federal requirements. An aspect of this plan involves partnering with the Alabama Rural Water Association (ARWA).

In FY2008, the Department contracted with the ARWA for the ARWA to provide a capacity development report for eleven water systems which were having difficulty complying with regulations. Those water systems were: Camp Hill Utilities Board (AL0001270), Crossville Water Board (AL0000508), East Brewton Water and Sewer Board (AL0000558), Fords Valley and Hwy 278 Water Cooperative (AL0000575), Lexington Water Works Board (AL0000788), Newton Water Works Board (AL0000439), Old Suggsville Water and Fire Protection Authority (AL0001722), Spanish Fort Water System (AL0001727), Town Creek Water System (AL0000800), Wilcox County Water System (AL0001371), and York Water System (AL0001223). The Drinking Water Branch is working with these systems to correct the deficiencies noted during the Capacity Development Studies.

Also for FY2008, the Department prepared two reports to submit to the EPA and the Governor. The Department prepared and submitted the Annual Capacity Development Implementation Report to the EPA and the Triennial Capacity Development Report to the Governor. The Triennial Capacity Development Report includes the years 2006 through 2008 and was due by

October 1, 2008. These reports profile ADEM's work with public drinking water systems to improve their technical, financial, and managerial abilities.

Consumer Confidence Report Program

The 1996 amendments to the Safe Drinking Water Act (SDWA) require community water systems to provide an annual Consumer Confidence Report (CCR) to their customers. The content of the CCR and delivery method are dictated by Drinking Water Branch regulations. The CCR is to include information for each calendar year and is to be delivered to customers and the Drinking Water Branch no later than July 1 of the following year. In addition to the copy of the CCR supplied to the Branch, a water system must also submit a Certification Form stating the CCR delivery method met Division 7 regulations.

The CCR regulations were modified in FY2006 so that the copy of the CCR and the Certification Form are both due in the Drinking Water Branch on July 1. The modification was made so that there was only one deadline for the submittal of the CCR and Certification Form.

This Annual Report covers the CCRs for calendar year 2007. Of the approximately 500 water systems required to complete a CCR and Certification Form, 486 met the July 1 deadline. The Department issued draft Consent Orders to the fourteen water systems that did not submit the CCR and Certification Form by the deadline. These Consent Orders will be finalized in FY2009.

Potability Certificate Program

There is an agreement with the US Department of Agriculture (USDA) and the ADPH for ADEM to issue water potability certificates to meat processing facilities, ice producing facilities and dairies. These facilities are required to submit monthly bacteriological results and maintain a free chlorine residual of one part per million (ppm). Based on the review of twelve satisfactory monthly bacteriological results, renewal of the certificate is either granted or denied. In FY2008, a total of eight potability certificates were issued. They were renewals.

Bottled Water Program

The Drinking Water Branch is responsible for approving bottled water sources and keeps a database of approved sources in the state. An informational package is mailed to persons interested in the development of a bottled water source. This package lists the steps needed for approval of a bottled water source. Treatment of the source is based on its raw water quality. A Branch representative conducts an on-site inspection of the source and its treatment facility and issues an initial approval or non-approval of the bottled water source. After approval of a source, the Food and Drug Administration, through an agreement with the Alabama Department of Public Health (ADPH), is responsible for the regulation of all bottled water facilities.

Eight inquiries were received from individuals planning to develop a bottled water source in FY2008. Currently, there are 17 approved sources of bottled water in Alabama. The seventeen sources include the use of raw water from an approved public water supply source, and several private well and spring sources.

Water Well Driller Licensing Program

In FY2008, 120 well driller licenses were issued. Of the total number of licenses issued, 3 were new licensees. The Department received \$24,000 for license fees. There is a \$500.00 fine for drilling a well without a license.

For more information on qualifying for an Alabama Water Well Driller's License, applicants may apply to take the exam with LaserGrade Computer Based Testing at www.lasergrade.com or call 1-800-211-2754. The exams can be taken any time during business hours and are administered at approved locations.

Source Water Assessment – Surface Water Sources

Alabama has completed the process of assessing the source waters for each of its active surface water treatment plants, as required by amendments to the Safe Drinking Act of 1996. The 73 water systems include 86 active water treatment plants.

An assessment must be completed on a proposed new surface water source, prior to issuing a permit to construct the intake from that source. During FY2008, there were no proposed raw water sources; therefore no SWAPs have been completed. The assessments are to be reviewed, and updated if necessary, when the system applies to renew its operating permit (every 6 years). A completed SWAP for a surface water source must include the following:

- Delineation of the watershed,
- Contaminant source inventory,
- Susceptibility analysis of each possible contaminant source in the inventory,
- Contingency plan, and
- A public awareness requirement

The majority of potential contaminant sites within the source water assessment areas have been given a "low susceptibility" ranking. The main reason for this is that many of the reservoirs were originally constructed as drinking water sources, and therefore, use by the public is strictly controlled. The majority of potential contaminants stem from highway bridge crossings where vehicular traffic is high but the potential for a "contamination event" is low.

Source Water Assessment – Groundwater Sources

All public water supply systems with ground water sources have completed a SWAP for each of their existing sources. All water systems are required to update their SWAP's when applying for reissuance of their permits-to-furnish water. All new groundwater sources must have a completed SWAP, prior to using the source for potable water. A completed SWAP for a groundwater source must include the following:

- Delineation of the source water assessment area (SWAA),
- An inventory of the possible contaminant sources within the SWAA,
- A susceptibility analysis of each possible contaminant source in the inventory, and
- A public awareness requirement

When the SWAP requirements were initially promulgated, Alabama had a total of 414 public water supply systems that utilized one or more groundwater sources. These systems were

required to complete a SWAP for their groundwater sources. The public water supply systems were categorized as follows:

- 310 Community Groundwater Systems
- 75 Non-Community Transient Groundwater Systems, and
- 29 Non-Community Non-Transient Groundwater Systems

During FY2008, Alabama received Source Water Assessment Reports for 17 new or expanded groundwater sources. All of these new Source Water Assessment Reports were from existing public water systems for new wells.

Wellhead Protection Program

The wellhead protection program is regulated through the Drinking Water regulations, but is administered by a staff member in ADEM's Groundwater Branch.

Underground storage tanks are the greatest source of chemical contaminants in ground water in Alabama. Approximately 515 UST compliance inspections were completed within wellhead protection areas. Approximately 74 corrective action sites are located within a wellhead protection area. Two UIC permits were reissued within a wellhead area.

The 2008 Alabama Groundwater Conference was held on June 4. There were approximately 190 registered.

ADEM continues to support and be part of the Groundwater Guardian Program. ADEM was designated a Groundwater Guardian Affiliate for the 13th year. In addition, nine communities in Alabama were designated by the National Groundwater Foundation as Groundwater Guardians. The communities include the City of Tusculumbia, the City of Eufaula, Madison County, Crenshaw County, Sumter/Marengo Counties, the St. Clair County Groundwater Festival Committee, the Etowah County Groundwater Festival Committee, the Covington County Water Festival Committee, and the Washington County Water Festival Committee.

The Groundwater Festival Program continues to be a part of the Wellhead Protection Program by providing a structured outreach and education event. It provides an avenue for utilities to become involved in and initiate drinking water education programs in their service area. ARWA, with input from ADEM, continues to maintain the Water Festival website. Groundwater Festivals were held in 23 counties in the State and hosted 23,145 students. ADEM continues to offer the Festival grant, which provides a maximum of \$1,000 to each county. All 23 counties that applied were awarded the grant. ADEM continues to actively recruit counties to participate in Groundwater Festivals. The Department gave presentations on Groundwater Festivals to representatives from Henry and Macon County. The Department also met with officials from Cherokee County and DeKalb County to discuss the possibility of starting a Groundwater Festival.

Area Wide Optimization Program (AWOP) Participation

ADEM continued to be an active participant in the EPA Region 4 Area Wide Optimization Multi-State Pilot Program. The AWOP-MSPP is a cooperative effort to optimize performance of existing surface water treatment plants. The main goal of the program is to maximize public

health protection from microbial contaminants and disinfection byproducts by coordinating existing system resources with proven performance improvement tools. Other States participating in the program include Georgia, Kentucky, South Carolina, North Carolina and Florida. Several members of the Drinking Water Branch’s Surface Water Section participated in and conducted activities associated with AWOP-MSPP. These activities included the following:

- ADEM staff attended the three AWOP planning meetings and workshops during FY2008. These meetings were held in November 2007 in Frankfort, KY; March 2008 in Montgomery, AL; and August 2008 in Wakulla Springs, FL.
- ADEM participated in developmental activities for the Distribution System Comprehensive Performance Evaluation with the EPA Technical Support Center during FY2008. ADEM is participating in a Comprehensive Technical Assistance program with the City of Tuscaloosa, EPA Technical Service Center, and Process Applications, Inc.
- ADEM conducted a tenth annual training session for surface water treatment plant personnel in October 2008 at Auburn University Montgomery.
- ADEM completed the first round of Performance Based Training (PBT) for Disinfection Byproducts (DBP) with six water systems during the year. A second round of DBP PBT was started in FY2008. PBT is the follow-up component being developed by the Region 4 AWOP-MSPP. It is designed to utilize centralized training events for multiple utilities to achieve documented and measurable results toward optimization.
- Each Surface Water Engineer has made AWOP a priority for the systems in their district and incorporates AWOP into their daily activities.

Drinking Water Branch enforcement activities are shown above in Table 4. Follow-up inspections were held with nine water systems that incurred MCL violations. These follow-up inspections were conducted as either separate inspections or in conjunction with the annual or sanitary survey inspection, if an annual survey had not been conducted during that fiscal year. Circumstances surrounding the violation were discussed and, if necessary, procedural changes were implemented by the system to prevent recurrence of the violation. 12 consent orders were issued against water systems for incurring more than one disinfection byproduct MCL violation in a twelve month period.

Bacteriological Monitoring and Compliance

A total of 534 community water systems were required to monitor for bacteriological contaminants. 27 systems incurred monitoring violations, and six systems incurred MCL violations. The CWM and Glenwood water systems incurred three monitoring violations each for failing to collect bacteriological samples in three separate months of the fiscal year. The Florala, Pollard, Ridge Road, and Woodland water systems also incurred more than one monitoring violation. Gurley was the only system to incur more than one maximum contaminant level violation. A complete list of all water systems with bacteriological violations can be found in Appendices B and C.

95% of the community water systems were in compliance with monitoring and reporting requirements for the Coliform standard and 99% were in compliance with MCL standards. Bacteriological compliance rates were the same for monitoring and reporting requirements and were slightly higher for maximum contaminant levels as the previous fiscal year.

26 Non-Transient Non-Community (NTNC) Water Systems were required to monitor for bacteriological contaminants. Three NTNC water systems incurred monitoring violations. The Tate and Lyle Sucralose water system incurred two MCL violations.

62 Transient Non-Community (TNC) Water Systems were required to monitor for bacteriological contaminants. Ten systems incurred 18 monitoring violations, and four systems incurred MCL violations. The Camp ASSCA, Dixie Flea and Farmers Market, Lakeside Marina, and Old Cahawba Preservation Project water systems incurred more than one monitoring violation. 84% of the TNC water systems were in compliance with monitoring and reporting requirements for the Coliform standard. 94% of the systems were in compliance with MCL standards. Both compliance rates were slightly higher than last year.

Chemical Monitoring and Compliance

Chemical monitoring is scheduled based on the calendar year. Therefore, only a summary of the results for the present fiscal year will be included in this annual report. A complete report of chemical compliance data for calendar year 2008 will be included in the 2008 annual violations report which will be produced in May or June 2009.

131 water systems monitored for inorganic contaminants. All water systems with sources were required to monitor for nitrates, with no system incurring an MCL violation.

269 water systems monitored for volatile organic chemicals (VOCs). Of the 545 ground and surface sources analyzed during the fiscal year, 70 sources contained twelve different regulated VOCs. Appendix D lists the organic chemical contaminant detections by water source.

210 water systems monitored for synthetic organic chemicals (SOCs). Of the 426 ground and surface sources analyzed for SOCs, 42 sources contained twelve different regulated SOCs.

73 surface and 53 ground water systems were required to monitor for turbidity. Although several systems were late in reporting turbidity data during the year, no systems incurred treatment technique violations or monitoring violations.

Lead and Copper Monitoring Program

278 systems monitored for Lead and Copper in FY2008. No water system exceeded the lead and copper action level in FY2008. 14 water systems incurred monitoring violations for failing to collect lead and copper water samples between June and September 2008.

Disinfection Byproduct Monitoring and Compliance

378 community and NTNC water systems were required to monitor for disinfection byproducts. DBPs include total trihalomethanes (TTHM) and haloacetic acids (HAA5). Listed below are the systems that incurred MCL violations.

The Department has issued orders against 12 of the above systems and is in the process of issuing orders against 5 others that have incurred more than one violation. The order will require the system to return to compliance within a specified amount of time. Seven water systems incurred monitoring violations for disinfection byproducts during FY2008.

All systems with a surface source or a source that is classified as groundwater under the influence of surface water (GWUDI) are required to monitor for total organic carbon (TOC).

These systems were required to collect raw water and a combined filtered water sample each month. TOC results from each plant are evaluated to determine if the plant is meeting TOC removal requirements or to determine if monitoring could be reduced to quarterly for TOCs. No water systems incurred treatment technique violations for failure to meet TOC removal requirements.

Laboratory Certification Program

Department regulations require an annual fee for recertification of Drinking Water Laboratories. The fee for certification varied from \$170.00 for bacteriological certification to a maximum of \$680.00 for chemical laboratory certification. Eleven thousand six hundred ten dollars (\$11,610) were collected in laboratory certification fees. All chemical and bacteriological analyses of water samples required by the State must be analyzed at a laboratory certified by ADEM.

41 bacteriological laboratories were certified during the fiscal year. There were three new certified bacteriological laboratories and six laboratories chose not to renew their certification in FY2008. The certified bacteriological laboratories consisted of three State Health Department laboratories, 27 water system laboratories, nine commercial laboratories, one county laboratory and one state college laboratory.

39 (15 in-state and 24 out-of-state) chemical laboratories were certified during the fiscal year. There were 2 new certified chemical laboratories and 17 (4 in-state and 13 out-of-state) laboratories chose not to renew their certification in FY2008. Appendices E and F contain a list of certified chemical and bacteriological laboratories.

The Department allowed certified chemical laboratories to choose their own supplier of performance evaluation (PE) samples. Laboratories are allowed one retest for any contaminant they failed during the first PE study.

Drinking Water State Revolving Fund Activities

The Drinking Water State Revolving Fund Annual Report is incorporated by reference and has been submitted to the SRF & Surface Water Grants Section of EPA Region IV under separate cover.

Operator Certification Program

The FY2008 Alabama Operator Certification Annual Report is incorporated by reference and has been submitted to the EPA Region IV Operator Certification Coordinator under separate cover.

Response to Natural Disasters

The Department, learning from past emergencies and natural disasters, is working to ensure that all emergency responders are NIMS (National Incident Management Systems) compliant in order to assist water utilities, if applicable, during localized response to an emergency or natural disaster. This will also insure responders are prepared for standardized procedures implemented when responding to a large scale incident as part of a national response team. The Department is also continuing its efforts, working with AWWA, NRWA and other water associations and agencies to create ALWarn (Alabama's Water/Wastewater Agency-Utility Response Network).

This will be a network of utilities helping utilities united by a common enemy (natural disasters and human-caused disasters). This is not a corporation or a governmental unit, but simply utilities organized within Alabama by agreement to help each other with personnel and resources during these emergencies and disasters, especially during hurricane seasons.
