



Federal License or Permit Activities Occuring Within the Coastal Area of Alabama

Description: Decision on an Applicant's Statement of Coastal Consistency

Issuing Division: FOD **Branch:** Mobile

When is a permit required? A certification decision is required when a private individual or business, or a state or local government, or any other type of non-federal entity applies to the federal government for a required permit or license or any other type of authorization subject to the requirements of CZMA section 307(c) (3)(A)(16U.S.C. section 1456 (c) (3)(A)) and 15 C.F.R. Part 930, Subparts A, B, and D if the activity is located in the coastal area of Alabama and the activity has reasonable foreseeable effect's on the state's coastal resources. Typical activities are those requiring Corps of Engineers 404 permits (e.g. wetlands fill); Sections 10 and 11 of the River and Harbor Act of 1899 (e.g. dredging , piers, docks, marinas, et al).
