WPI (ABC) IS REVISING EXAMS AND MOVING TO SCALED SCORING

Revised exams will be based on revised "Need to Know" (NTK) Criteria. All revised exam questions will be sourced from either the WEF Manuals, AWWA manuals or Sacramento State OWP manuals. The revised NTK will indicate which book is the primary resource and which is the secondary resource for each topic.

EXAM TAKERS, CHECK THE FCT GIVEN AT THE TEST CENTER

When you arrive at a PSI Test Center, you will be given a paper Formula/ Conversion Table (FCT).

The Water FCTs are NOT THE SAME as the Wastewater FCTs.

Please check that you have been given the correct sheet. If not, let the test center personnel know and ask for the correct FCT. There is also a digital FCT for each test. Check that too.

SKILLS FOR SUCCESS: WATER TREATMENT FUNDAMENTALS

- Designed for new employees;
- Instruction comparable to a new employee's first 30-60 days;
- Can be used as a review of water treatment fundamentals;
- Suitable for water or wastewater treatment facility operators;
- Free to students;
- By Fall of 2025, it will be an approved course option for Alabama high schools, including trade schools;
- Supported by Alabama Community Colleges statewide.



Step 1: Register with your local community college



Step 2: Take the theory lessons online



Step 3: Attend a hands-on, 2-3 day, in-person evaluation by a water treatment professional

THEORY SKILLS COVERED WILL INCLUDE ...

Personal Protective Equipment (PPE); pumps, valves, lab meters, probes, mixers (stir bars); chlorine dilution and dosing; pH, turbidity and chlorine testing; sand filter, multimedia and activated carbon filter operation and maintenance; UV/chlorine disinfection operation and maintenance; and more.

WE WILL NEED EXPERIENCED INDIVIDUALS TO PERFORM THE IN-PERSON EVALUATIONS

If you have at least 5 years of water treatment experience, can explain and evaluate any of the processes listed above, and would like more information, please click this link and complete the interest form. WE WILL NEED LOCATIONS TO HOST THE IN-PERSON EVALUATIONS

Across the state, we will need water and wastewater treatment facilities to host the in-person evaluations. Your facility does not have to have all the processes available. In some locations, we may need to combine resources of more than one facility to cover all the theory.
