#### **FINDINGS**

Pursuant to the provisions of the Alabama Environmental Management Act, Ala. Code §§ 22-22A-1 to 22-22A-17, as amended; the Solid Wastes and Recyclable Materials Management Act (SWRMMA), Ala. Code §§ 22-27-1 to 22-27-18, as amended; and the Alabama Department of Environmental Management's ("ADEM" or "Department") Administrative Code of Regulations ("ADEM Admin. Code r.") promulgated pursuant thereto, the Department makes the following FINDINGS:

- 1. James Lawson Pitts ("Pitts") owns real property located at 771 County Road 146, which is further identified as Parcel ID Number 14-03-05-0-000-090.004, in Leesburg, Cherokee County, Alabama ("the Site"), where regulated solid waste was discovered discarded or disposed of.
- 2. Pursuant to <u>Ala. Code</u> §§ 22-22A-1 to 22-22A-17, as amended, the Department is a duly constituted Department of the State of Alabama.
- 3. Pursuant to <u>Ala. Code</u> § 22-22A-4(n), as amended, and <u>Ala. Code</u> § 22-27-9(a), as amended, the Department is the state agency authorized to administer and enforce the provisions of the SWRMMA, <u>Ala. Code</u> §§ 22-27-1 to 22-27-18, as amended.
- 4. Pursuant to <u>Ala. Code</u> § 22-27-10(b), as amended, and ADEM Admin. Code r. 335-13-11-.03(2), any person who participates in the creation or operation of an unauthorized dump, or contributed to an unauthorized dump, shall be responsible for the removal of the waste or otherwise the closure of the unauthorized dump in accordance with this article and rules of the department. If those who created,

operated, or contributed to an unauthorized dump do not remove or close the unauthorized dump, the landowner shall also be responsible for the removal or otherwise the closure of the unauthorized dump.

- 5. Pursuant to ADEM Admin. Code rs. 335-13-1-.13(1)(a) and (2), unauthorized dumps are prohibited and must be closed in a manner determined to be necessary by the Department.
- 6. In response to a complaint, the Department conducted an investigation that included an initial site inspection on April 29,2021, followed by a records review. The following was noted:
  - A. Approximately five cubic yards of construction/demolition waste and household waste, along with 200 scrap tires, were improperly disposed of at the Site.
  - B. The disposal area at the Site did not meet the technical standards for landfills set out in Chapter 335-13-4, and the disposal area had not been permitted as a land disposal facility by the Department as required under Chapter 335-13-5.
  - C. According to the Cherokee County property tax records Pitts was the Site's owner at the time of the inspection.
  - D. An unauthorized dump ("UAD") refers to any collection of solid waste either dumped, caused to be dumped, or placed on any public or private property, without having a permit from the Department, regardless of whether the property is regularly used. Therefore, disposing of regulated solid waste on the Site without a solid waste disposal facility permit issued by the Department constitutes the creation of an unauthorized dump, which violates rules 335-13-1-.13(1) and 335-13-1-.13(2), for which Pitts is responsible.
- 7. On May 11, 2021, the Department issued Pitts a Notice of Violation ("NOV") via Certified Mail through the United States Postal Service ("USPS") for creating a UAD. The NOV mandated that Pitts completely eliminate and close the

UAD, as well as submit documentation to the Department verifying that all regulated waste had been removed from the Site and properly transported to an authorized facility. According to the USPS online tracking system, the NOV was delivered on June 4, 2021.

- 8. On May 23, 2024, Department personnel conducted a follow-up inspection at the Site and found that a UAD remained. This UAD consisted of comprised of approximately 20 cubic yards of rubbish, scrap metal that was not being managed in a matter that suggested it was a valuable commodity, and 34 scrap tires.
  - 9. To date, Pitts has failed to respond to the NOV.
- 10. Pursuant to Ala. Code § 22-22A-5(18)c., as amended, in determining the amount of any penalty, the Department must give consideration to the seriousness of the violation, including any irreparable harm to the environment and any threat to the health or safety of the public; the standard of care manifested by such person; the economic benefit which delayed compliance may confer upon such person; the nature, extent, and degree of success of such person's efforts to minimize or mitigate the effects of such violation upon the environment; such person's history of previous violations; and the ability of such person to pay such penalty. Any civil penalty assessed pursuant to this authority shall not exceed \$25,000 for each violation, provided however, that the total penalty assessed in an order issued by the Department shall not exceed \$250,000. Each day such a violation continues shall constitute a separate violation. In arriving at this civil penalty, the Department has considered the following:
  - A. SERIOUSNESS OF THE VIOLATION: The creation, contribution to, or operation of a UAD is inherently a public nuisance, a threat to public health, and a threat to the environment. The Department is not aware of any irreparable harm to the environment, or any immediate threat to human health or the safety of the public as a result of the UAD's presence on the Site.

- B. THE STANDARD OF CARE: Pitts failed to abide by requirements applicable to the lawful disposal of regulated solid waste and failed to comply with directives from the Department regarding the proper abatement and closure of the UAD.
- C. ECONOMIC BENEFIT WHICH DELAYED COMPLIANCE MAY HAVE CONFERRED: The Department has been unable to establish if Pitts has realized a significant economic benefit as a result of the violation cited herein.
- D. EFFORTS TO MINIMIZE OR MITIGATE THE EFFECTS OF THE VIOLATION UPON THE ENVIRONMENT: The Department is unaware of efforts by Pitts to mitigate any potential adverse effects upon the environment, human health, or public safety that may have been caused as a result of the UAD.
- E. HISTORY OF PREVIOUS VIOLATIONS: Based on a review of Department records, Pitts does not appear to have a documented history of violations of the applicable requirements of ADEM Admin. Code div. 335-13.
- F. THE ABILITY TO PAY: The Department has no evidence indicating Pitts' inability to pay the civil penalty assessed herein.
- 11. The Department has carefully considered the six statutory penalty factors enumerated in <u>Ala. Code</u> § 22-22A-5(18)c, as amended, as well as other factors, and has concluded that a civil penalty is appropriate for the violation cited herein (see Attachment A, which is made a part of the Department's FINDINGS).

#### ORDER

Based on the foregoing FINDINGS and pursuant to <u>Ala. Code</u>, §§ 22-22A-5(1), 22-22A-5(10), 22-22A-5(18), 22-27-4(b), 22-27-7, and 22-27-11, as amended, it is hereby ORDERED:

A. That, no later than forty-five days of the issuance of this Order, Pitts shall pay the Department a civil penalty of \$3,000 for the violation cited herein. The penalty shall be made payable to the Alabama Department of Environmental Management by certified or cashier's check or any other method of payment acceptable to the Department and shall be remitted to:

All payments shall reference Pitts's name and address and the ADEM Administrative Order number of this action.

- B. That, immediately upon issuance of this Order and continuing each and every day thereafter, Pitts shall cease and desist from creating, operating, or contributing to any UADs.
- C. That, within thirty days of issuance of this Order, Pitts shall submit a site closure plan to the Department in accordance with ADEM Admin. Code r. 335-13-1-.13(2)(b)1. This plan must outline the actions Pitts will undertake to remove all regulated solid waste from the Site and transport it to an approved landfill unit or registered recycling facility, including a timeline for the completion of all remediation and closure activities. Unless otherwise directed by the Department, Pitts shall execute the site closure plan as outlined and adhere to all relevant and applicable requirements of Division 335-13 of the ADEM Admin. Code.
- D. That, within fifteen days of completion of remediation and closure activities, Pitts shall provide the following information to the Department as proof that all remediation and closure actions have been completed:
  - 1. The period during which the remediation activities took place.
  - 2. Total volume of regulated solid waste removed from the Site.

- 3. Documentation confirming that all regulated solid waste, including both surface and subsurface waste, was removed from the Site.
- 4. A copy of receipts showing that all regulated waste was taken to an approved landfill or registered recycling facility.
- 5. Photographs of the solid waste disposal area(s) at the Site taken before and after remediation.
- 6. Documentation confirming that the UAD was properly closed to prevent erosion on the Site, if applicable.
- 7. Documentation confirming that the Site has been secured to prevent any future illegal dumping, if applicable.
- E. That, should any provision of this Order be declared by a court of competent jurisdiction or the Environmental Management Commission to be inconsistent with Federal or State law and, therefore, unenforceable, the remaining provisions hereof shall remain in full force and effect.
- F. That the issuance of this Order does not preclude the Department from seeking criminal fines or other appropriate sanctions or relief against Pitts for the violation cited herein.
- G. That failure to comply with the provisions of the Order shall constitute cause for commencement of legal action by the Department against Pitts for recovery of additional civil penalties, criminal fines, or other appropriate sanctions or relief.
