1 CHAIRMAN MCFADDEN: All right.
2 Welcome everyone. We'll get the
3 meeting started.
4 It is 11:00 o'clock and
5 we'll call the meeting to order and
6 acknowledge we do have a quorum. And
7 the first thing on the item is a
8 consideration of the minutes from the
9 December 12th meeting.
10 Do I hear a motion to
11 accept the minutes?
12 DR. TUCKER: I move to accept
13 the minutes.
14 MR. BROWN: Motion.
15 MR. MCKINSTRY: Second.
16 CHAIRMAN MCFADDEN: Any
17 discussion? All in favor, raise your
18 hand.
19 (Commission members raising
20 hands).
21 CHAIRMAN MCFADDEN: All opposed?
22 (No response).
23 CHAIRMAN MCFADDEN: Motion

1 carries.
2 Okay. Second, a report
3 from the Director, Mr. Poolos?
4 MR. POOLOS: Good morning, and
5 welcome to the third meeting of the
6 Alabama Environmental and Management
7 Commission for FY 2026. It's great
8 seeing everyone here today.
9 CHAIRMAN MCFADDEN: You too.
10 MR. POOLOS: I have a few items
11 that I wish to brief you on that have
12 occurred since the last meeting. And
13 at the end of my report, we will
14 start something a little different
15 that I mentioned to you, previously.
16 I wanted to create a way for the
17 Department to highlight some of the
18 great work being done by our
19 employees.
20 So, at each Commission
21 meeting going forward, a different
22 Division Chief will briefly highlight
23 a program within their Division.

Page 5

1 Water Division is who drew the short
 2 straw and will be the first Division
 3 to present, but Daphne Lutz, the
 4 Chief of the Water Division, she is
 5 out dealing with a family illness.
 6 So, I guess, actually, Jeff
 7 drew the short straw and Jeff will do
 8 her presentation today.
 9 The first item I wish to
 10 update you on is regarding the
 11 Department's budget. On January 8th,
 12 Congress passed the FY-26 federal
 13 budget for EPA and it included
 14 funding for categorical grants used
 15 by the states.
 16 This includes our Federal
 17 Performance Partnership Grant, known
 18 as the PPG Grant, that helps fund our
 19 programs where we have been delegated
 20 primacy from EPA. These grants will
 21 remain level funded for this fiscal
 22 year.
 23 This is a much higher level

1 making this appointment and are proud
 2 that our General Counsel has this
 3 title.
 4 On top of Todd's promotion,
 5 I am pleased to announce today that
 6 Carrie Blanton has accepted a
 7 promotion to the newly created Chief
 8 Litigation Counsel position. The
 9 Chief Litigation Counsel will be
 10 responsible for overseeing and
 11 coordinating the legal representation
 12 of the Department in court and
 13 administrative appeal proceedings.
 14 As Chief Litigation
 15 Counsel, she will play a critical
 16 role in ensuring that the Department
 17 receives fair and just outcomes in
 18 legal and administrative proceedings.
 19 Carrie's expertise, dedication and
 20 oratory skills make her the perfect
 21 person for this position. And we are
 22 excited about her new role within the
 23 Department.

1 than was first proposed in the
 2 President's budget request.
 3 On the state side, the
 4 Governor's General Fund request for
 5 FY-27, level funds the Department's
 6 operational budget and includes a
 7 slight increase in our SRF match.
 8 This budget will now work its way
 9 through the state legislative process
 10 and we will be following that
 11 intently.
 12 The next item is one that I
 13 am extremely happy to announce. This
 14 is regarding our Legal Office. On
 15 January 29th, Attorney General Steve
 16 Marshall promoted ADEM's General
 17 Counsel, Todd Carter, to a Deputy
 18 Attorney General position.
 19 This is the first time in
 20 more than twelve years that ADEM has
 21 had a Deputy Attorney General. This
 22 is a great honor for Todd and we
 23 truly appreciate the Attorney General

 2 please stand to be recognized? Todd
 3 Carter.
 4 MR. CARTER: Yes.
 5 (Applause).
 6 MR. POOLOS: We are very excited
 7 about that for the Department. Thank

 10 they're excited about it. It sounds
 11 like a tough job to me.

 18 am always excited to cover and that

 2 granted their professional
 3 geologist's license. That is a long,
 4 difficult process and I want you to
 5 join me in congratulating these two

7 The first one, who could
 8 not be here today and that is Gigi
 9 Copeland. Just because she couldn't
 10 be here today, I still wanted to
 11 announce her significant
 12 achievements.

13 The second is Robert
 14 Stanley. I know Robert is here.
 15 Robert, will you please stand and be
 16 recognized?

17 (Applause).

18 MR. POOLOS: Congratulations,
 19 Robert, we are extremely proud of
 20 your achievement.

21 Next, I wish to update you
 22 on the ARPA funding for Drinking
 23 Water and Wastewater Improvements.

1 Standards.

2 As proposed in this rule,
 3 EPA found that Alabama's SIP had
 4 adequate data that demonstrated it
 5 was not interfering with ozone
 6 attainment for the 2015 eight-hour
 7 NAAQS in any other state.

8 We truly appreciate EPA's
 9 efforts regarding this
 10 reconsideration.

11 So, the final item that I
 12 have is regarding the water quality
 13 criteria rule changes as required by
 14 the granting of the petition in June
 15 of last year. These rule changes
 16 were placed on notice in November of
 17 last year, came off notice on January
 18 12th and a public hearing was held on
 19 that same day on January the 12th.

20 We received 64 comments
 21 from individuals or organizations
 22 totaling 1,550 pages. We are in the
 23 process of replying to these

1 This is funding that came
 2 through the COVID CARES Act and was
 3 appropriated for water and wastewater
 4 infrastructure projects by the
 5 Alabama Legislature. They
 6 appropriated \$615 million under this
 7 program, and all of these funds have
 8 been obligated through 492 grant
 9 agreements.

10 As of yesterday, almost
 11 \$332 million of these funds have been
 12 expended. That is right at 54% of
 13 the money that is already out the
 14 door. And as a reminder, these funds
 15 must be spent by December of 2026.

16 Another item is on January
 17 27th, EPA announced it was proposing
 18 the reconsideration of Phase I of
 19 the, "Good Neighbor Plan."

20 This proposal will approve
 21 Alabama's State Implementation Plan
 22 or SIP pertaining to the eight-hour
 23 Ozone National Ambient Air Quality

1 comments.

2 As a reminder, these rules
 3 will come before you as a commission
 4 at the next meeting in April.

5 That completes my portion
 6 of the report, but I am happy to
 7 answer any questions before I turn it
 8 over to Jeff.

9 CHAIRMAN MCFADDEN: Does anybody
 10 have any questions, any of the
 11 Commissioners?

12 (No response).

13 CHAIRMAN MCFADDEN: Okay. Thank
 14 you-all.

15 MR. KITCHENS: Good morning,
 16 Chairman McFadden, Commission
 17 members.

18 CHAIRMAN MCFADDEN: Good
 19 morning.

20 MR. KITCHENS: As you all know,
 21 I'm Jeff Kitchens. I'm the Deputy
 22 Director. As Ed said, I'm filling in
 23 for Daphne today giving this

2 And, today, I'm channeling

3 my inner Lance LeFleur. So, if you

4 will bear with me, I've got about a

5 30-minute presentation. So, I will

6 just keep this a little bit short.

7 But, as the Director said,

8 he had asked Daphne to highlight a

9 success story and explain some of the

10 great work that is being done by the

11 employees within our Water Division.

12 And while there are a

13 number of programs that we can talk

14 to you about, we chose the Water

15 Quality Branch as monitoring and

16 analysis work and that's a program

17 that is beneficial to all residents

18 in Alabama.

19 The employees within the

20 Water Quality Branch do a tremendous

21 amount of highly technical work to

22 help protect waterways within the

23 state.

1 On this slide, you can see

2 how the state is split into three

3 areas and depicted in yellow, blue

4 and pink. And ADEM focuses on one of

5 these target basins each calendar

6 year.

7 It may be a little bit

8 difficult to discern here, but we can

9 -- based on the fact that we do

10 combine some basins. We do all the

11 blue locations one year, the pink,

12 the next and then the yellow, the

13 next. And then this year, 2026,

14 we're concentrating on the basin

15 highlighted in yellow, which includes

16 the west Tennessee, portions of the

17 west Tennessee River, Tallapoosa,

18 Cahaba and the Alabama River and the

19 Mobile Bay.

20 In this slide here, you'll

21 see a map of all the stations that

22 have been sampled over the past three

23 years, covering all the basins in the

Page 14

1 ADEM conducts trend station

2 monitoring at approximately 31

3 stations multiple times each and

4 every year that's shown on this slide

5 that you have before you. This

6 monitoring provides vital information

7 on changes in water quality

8 throughout the year and from year to

9 year.

10 We've been conducting trend

11 station monitoring in Alabama since

12 the 1970s. We have a tremendous

13 amount of data regarding water

14 quality trends throughout the state.

15 In addition to those annual

16 trend stations, sampling that occur

17 every year, ADEM conducts an

18 additional water quality monitoring

19 using a three year rotating basin

20 approach.

21 Under this approach, the

22 state's major basins are sampled at

23 least once every three years.

Page 16

1 state.

2 We've sampled about 780

3 plus stations around the state.

4 These stations are mostly sampled

5 each month from March through

6 October.

7 And this sampling has

8 resulted in almost 450,000 water

9 quality data records.

10 And so the Department does

11 have extensive water quality data

12 that we've collected over the years.

13 And, on this, since about 1978, you

14 can see that we've sampled over 3,000

15 stations and have almost four million

16 data records.

17 Annually, our Water Quality

18 Branch works with our Field

19 Operations Division and other

20 programs of ADEM to determine the

21 locations and the parameters to be

22 sampled and the frequency of sampling

23 to obtain information regarding water

Page 17

1 quality.

2 I would be remiss if I

3 didn't mention that our Field

4 Operations Division collects the

5 majority of these samples with some

6 assistance from our Water Quality

7 Branch. And after those samples are

8 collected, the samples are analyzed

9 by the laboratory groups within Field

10 Operations.

11 Scott Hughes, who heads up

12 our Field Operations Division, is

13 here today. And I'd like to thank

14 him and our Field Operations

15 Division, as well as our Water

16 Quality Branch.

17 In this slide here, I know

18 it's going to be a little bit hard to

19 see, and I don't expect you to read

20 through all this, but I just wanted

21 to give it as an indication of how

22 many parameters we do sample. But on

23 this slide, it shows a list of the

Page 18

1 routine water quality pollutants

2 and/or parameters that we would most

3 always obtain samples from and quite

4 a number of additional parameters

5 that we may have analyzed or shown on

6 this slide when we do both the trend

7 and the basin rotation stations.

8 Something not included on

9 the previous slides are additional

10 studies that the Water Quality Branch

11 conducts. These include studies,

12 such as the 72-hour diurnal or the

13 dissolved oxygen studies to collect

14 continuous field data, time of travel

15 studies to determine stream flows and

16 intensive surveys which are targeted,

17 short term and high frequency

18 monitoring activities.

19 All of these are labor

20 intensive, and I appreciate the Water

21 Quality Branch's dedication and the

22 Field Operations Group for their

23 dedication to collecting this vital

Page 19

1 information.

2 But collecting water

3 quality data is just the first step.

4 After the water, the Field Operations

5 Division and Water Quality Branch

6 completes all the lab work and the

7 quality assurance and control work.

8 Then the Water Quality Branch reviews

9 and interprets this data and uses it

10 for a multitude of purposes, such as

11 to assess if water bodies are meeting

12 the water quality standards.

13 If a water body is listed

14 as "impaired," that means it doesn't

15 meet the water quality standards and

16 monitoring results can be used to

17 help identify causes of impairments,

18 to upgrade water body use

19 classifications, such as use is

20 considered less than the Clean Water

21 Act fishable, swimmable goal, to

22 develop eco-regional reference

23 benchmarks, which are levels of

Page 20

1 pollutants expected for minimally

2 impacted water bodies in a specific

3 region, to establish existing levels

4 of emerging contaminants in water

5 bodies, such as PFAS, to develop

6 water quality models, which are tools

7 to predict water quality conditions

8 under various scenarios and/or

9 conditions.

10 And these models can be

11 used to develop protected permit

12 limits for our NPDES Program, to

13 develop total maximum daily loads,

14 which are allowable limits to

15 loadings to impaired waterbodies to

16 attainment status, to develop water

17 quality standards such as Chlorophyll

18 A, which are used to help develop

19 standards, which are to prevent algae

20 blooms and ensure other criteria such

21 as dissolved oxygen levels are

22 achieved, to determine if the TMDL

23 implementation or activities or other

Page 21

1 remediations have resulted in
 2 impaired waterbody meeting its water
 3 quality standards or if the waterways
 4 have recovered after a spill or a
 5 release, to designate special
 6 waterbodies, such as the Treasured
 7 Alabama Lakes or Outstanding National
 8 Resource Water.

9 Determine the particular
 10 cause of fish kills, to determine the
 11 effects of permitted and unpermitted
 12 discharges, to notify the Department
 13 of Public Health the potential issues
 14 in water quality that could affect
 15 public health so that health
 16 advisories can be issued, and then
 17 the development of GIS maps, which
 18 are available to the public that
 19 provide a wealth of data and
 20 information in an interactive format.

21 Now, these are just some of
 22 the activities that the Water Quality
 23 Branch performs with our water

Page 22

1 quality data.

2 And finally, what I've
 3 highlighted today is just our Water
 4 Quality Monitoring Program. But
 5 within the Water Division, as well as
 6 other Divisions across the
 7 Department, we could conduct
 8 additional monitoring related to
 9 ground water, wastewater and storm
 10 water discharges from numerous source
 11 types, as well as drinking water.

12 A large data set of
 13 reliable water quality data is very
 14 important. But how we use that data
 15 is where the rubber meets the road
 16 and these uses help protect waters in
 17 the state where you and I fish, swim,
 18 recreate and receive our drinking
 19 water.

20 We always like to highlight
 21 that we've made significant progress,
 22 meeting the Clean Water Act's goal to
 23 ensure that all of our water bodies

Page 23

1 are fishable and swimmable with
 2 greater than 99% of those water
 3 bodies now meeting that designation.

4 Again, I'd like to
 5 recognize the Water Quality Branch
 6 members that are here with us today.
 7 So, as I call your name, if you
 8 wouldn't mind standing and continue
 9 to stand.

10 We have Chris Johnson, who
 11 is the Chief of the Water Quality
 12 Branch. Rebecca Strickland, who is
 13 his assistant in the Water Quality
 14 Branch. Kimberly Minton, Chief of
 15 the Modeling and Analysis Section.
 16 Jennifer Haslbauer, Chief of the
 17 Standards and Planning Section.

18 Additional members of the
 19 Modeling and Analysis Section include
 20 Nick Caraway, Brian Haigler, Shae
 21 Holley, James Mooney, Keosha Stone,
 22 Jonathan Straiton and Hayden Wright,
 23 who can't be here today.

1 Additional members of the
 2 Standards and Planning Section,
 3 include Trevor Bates, Karla Crews,
 4 David Moore, Joseph Roy, David
 5 Thompson and last, but not least,
 6 Caitlin Washington.

7 I'd like to thank you for
 8 all you do for keeping our water
 9 safe. Thank you. I will be glad to
 10 answer your questions if you have
 11 any.

12 (Applause).

13 CHAIRMAN MCFADDEN: I think that
 14 shows where we are headed with water
 15 quality issues. Some of you know my
 16 tenure here back 37, 38 years ago. I
 17 was the one water quality person.

18 Now, you have that whole
 19 group that just stood up. So, I'm
 20 sorry. I didn't do what they're
 21 doing, but I think we tried to
 22 enumerate how many miles of streams
 23 we had back then. And, of course,

1 that was just the old map just by
2 hand, no GIS, no special stuff.
3 And now I think we've found
4 a whole lot more water in Alabama.
5 So, maybe that -- we need more
6 sampling, but good job guys. Chris,
7 good job for your group.
8 And does anybody else have
9 any questions for any director or
10 Jeff? Okay. Thank you very much.
11 Now, I have just a short
12 presentation here that we'll play. I
13 did not know that Jeff was going to
14 give that report on water quality,
15 especially focusing on the area of
16 the state, the watershed that feeds
17 Mobile Bay, but fish consumption and
18 some of those issues we're all
19 looking at now, as we know with the
20 petitions before us and all that.
21 So, we'll get another
22 independent review of this.
23 Sometimes the Department and we get

1 Shores. So, anyway, I thought that
2 was a good clip.
3 All right. Let's see.
4 Item -- Agenda Item Number 4 is Barry
5 Young, et al., Petitioners versus
6 ADEM, Respondent and Grayson Carter &
7 Son Contracting, Intervenor, EMC
8 Docket 26-02. And I'll just note
9 that on February the 4th, our last
10 meeting or share notes that on
11 February 4th, the parties filed a
12 Joint Motion to Continue Commission's
13 Consideration of Petitioner's Request
14 for Stay referencing in the Joint
15 Motion that the Petitioner's Request
16 for Stay is on the agenda for today's
17 meeting.
18 And all that means is that
19 it's not anything -- in some states,
20 they want to not allow the permit to
21 be in effect and all this. It's just
22 basically to kicking this decision on
23 the stay to the next Commission

1 good reviews. Sometimes we get bad
2 reviews. And that's just the way it
3 goes.
4 The good news, sometimes,
5 doesn't make it out. But, anyway,
6 let's play this short one-and-a-half,
7 two-minute video, and we'll see what
8 you think about it.
9 (Video played at 10:20 a.m.)
10 CHAIRMAN MCFADDEN: All right.
11 So, maybe that's a little good news
12 from an independent source. I did
13 have to think about the Chamber of
14 Commerce, the Gulf Shores and Orange
15 Beach and what that might do to
16 tourism, but I have it on good
17 authority from Richard Dreyfuss who
18 said these sharks go back to Amity
19 Island in the summertime because it's
20 cooler.
21 So, they're going up there
22 to terrorize them, and they will not
23 be down in Orange Beach and Gulf

1 meeting in June.
2 So, it's really -- it's
3 sort of like a continuance, I guess,
4 in the court hearing, but --
5 MR. BROWN: Not similar. It is.
6 CHAIRMAN MCFADDEN: It is.
7 MR. BROWN: It is a continuance.
8 That's what it's for.
9 CHAIRMAN MCFADDEN: Yes. You
10 get it from the expert. Our attorney
11 here.
12 All right. So, do we have
13 a motion?

11 register for three-minute sessions.

12 Is that correct, Debi?

17 try to limit these, but good to have

18 you. Thank you for coming.

19 MR. KISZLA: Thank you very

20 much. It's actually a minute more

21 than I was able to give in the

22 Statehouse to discuss this same

23 issue. So, I appreciate the extra

1 sessions that have been around there,

2 I haven't viewed many bills that are

3 concerning, particularly, relating to

4 Commission's purview as Senate Bill

5 71 of this Legislative Session.

6 My concerns about this bill

7 don't just relate to the environment.

8 They mainly relate to the shared

9 Alabama values that this bill

10 addresses or rather that this bill

11 harms.

12 The first Senate Bill 71

13 would tie Alabama's Environmental

14 Standards to federal law. Federal

15 law establishes that it itself is the

16 floor and this bill would say that

17 federal law is also the ceiling.

18 For the statement whose

19 model is "We dare defend our rights,"

20 I have not seen a bill so boldly

21 surrender our ability to defend the

22 rights of Alabamians. It is for that

23 reason that I'm primarily concerned

1 about this bill.
 2 But the bill has another
 3 thrust in it; and that is, to set up
 4 parameters regarding sound science.
 5 Supporters of this bill claim that
 6 this bill was similar to bills
 7 advanced in Tennessee and by
 8 President Trump's Executive Order
 9 regarding Gold Standard Science.
 10 The Senate Bill 71 misses
 11 the mark on both. Senate Bill 71
 12 would eliminate our ability to
 13 consider increased risk of cancer
 14 itself as a reason for manifest
 15 bodily harm resulting from exposure
 16 to toxic substances.
 17 This limitation is not
 18 found anywhere in either President
 19 Trump's Executive Order or this NSE
 20 bill that the supporters of this bill
 21 are likened it to.
 22 Secondly, there's other
 23 parameters put in this bill that

1 I believe in the power of truth and
 2 the power of debate.
 3 This legislation has
 4 received a neutral stance according
 5 to the sponsors from the Department
 6 of the Environmental Management, and
 7 I found that highly irregular from a
 8 bill that so deeply affects this
 9 Commission and this Department's
 10 purview.
 11 So, I recognize that this
 12 bill is before the Legislature. It,
 13 in fact, only has one final step
 14 before a final passage, and that's
 15 likely to occur on Tuesday. But I
 16 want to note that this is the first
 17 Environmental Management Commission
 18 meeting that has happened since this
 19 bill was introduced and this bill
 20 will likely become a law on Tuesday.
 21 So, I please ask the
 22 Commission to consider this bill and
 23 make your stance on this bill, then.

1 generally cull the ability of this
 2 Commission and other people that have
 3 a debate on what sound science is and
 4 what sound science is not.
 5 This Commission has made
 6 some pretty incredible strides
 7 forward over the recent past, and I
 8 would appreciate the Chairman
 9 McFadden's comments regarding the
 10 progress that's made in this
 11 Commission through his long sideline
 12 working with the Department.
 13 However, that debate that I
 14 treasure very highly, the debate
 15 about what sound science is and what
 16 sound science is not, that debate, in
 17 large, could be precluded if we adopt
 18 this legislation.
 19 I'm not a scientist. I'm
 20 not the person to come up here and
 21 argue about what sound science is and
 22 what sound science is not, but I
 23 appreciate having that debate because

1 Thank you very much, Mr.
 2 Chair, and thank you very much
 3 members of the Commission.
 4 CHAIRMAN MCFADDEN: Okay. Thank
 5 you, Mr. Kiszla. I appreciate that.
 6 Look out for Great Whites this winter
 7 until it warms up.
 8 MR. KISZLA: We've got more of
 9 those, now.
 10 CHAIRMAN MCFADDEN: Okay. Thank
 11 you.
 12 All right. The next person
 13 is Michael Mullen.
 14 MR. MULLEN: Thank you,
 15 Chairman. Thank you, Commissioners.
 16 CHAIRMAN MCFADDEN: Yes. Thank
 17 you for coming.
 18 MR. MULLEN: Luke has addressed
 19 very well just about everything I
 20 would say, except I want to give a
 21 specific example of what not being
 22 able to do, the regulation,
 23 ourselves, like me.

1 I'm in the Choctawhatchee
 2 River Basin. We have some extremely
 3 high PPOX coming off of Fort Rucker.
 4 We have been monitoring that for four
 5 years now. I believe this week, EPA
 6 has people out monitoring that
 7 because we've been asking this
 8 Department to do some fish
 9 monitoring. So, maybe we can get
 10 some limits set and maybe get some
 11 fish consumption advisories.
 12 This basically ties our
 13 hands. And worse than that, if you
 14 rely on the Feds, the Feds are doing
 15 everything they can right now to push
 16 PPOX Regulation on the report. This
 17 is an Alabama value to be able to go
 18 out and fish in our waters and catch
 19 fish and eat fish and not fear about
 20 the health, our health and our
 21 children's health. It's not going to
 22 bother me.
 23 But this is something, you

1 ought to -- it's your responsibility,
 2 you basically are the policy makers,
 3 environmental policy makers of the
 4 state. You ought to be communicating
 5 with the Legislature. Your Director
 6 ought to be communicating with the
 7 Legislature.
 8 And that's all I ask.
 9 There's not much time left, and the
 10 bill is probably going to pass
 11 anyway. It probably falls on us, not
 12 communicating with you before this.
 13 But I appreciate the
 14 opportunity and hope you will look
 15 after the folks in Alabama. Thank
 16 you.
 17 CHAIRMAN MCFADDEN: Thank you
 18 very much. I appreciate that input.
 19 Okay. If there's nothing
 20 else on the agenda, I want to
 21 entertain a motion to adjourn.
 22 MS. MERRITT: So moved.
 23 CHAIRMAN MCFADDEN: Second. Do

1 you-all want to stay here some more?
 2 MS. MERRITT: Is there a second?
 3 DR. TUCKER: Second.
 4 CHAIRMAN MCFADDEN: We're not
 5 paid by the hour. We're paid by the
 6 job.
 7 All right. We have a
 8 motion and a second. Any discussion
 9 or anything that we need to further
 10 discuss if that's why we had a little
 11 pause there?
 12 If not, all in favor of
 13 adjourning, raise your hand.
 14 (Commission members raising
 15 hands).
 16 CHAIRMAN MCFADDEN: Any oppose?
 17 (No response).
 18 CHAIRMAN MCFADDEN: We are
 19 adjourned. Thank you-all. I
 20 appreciate everybody coming.




